Dr. M.S. Biradar, popularly known as Dr.MSB Sir, is a name taken with lot of respect in the field of Medicine, Academics and Administration. He was Dedication and Perfection Personified. To me, My Father is a role model and my strength. I am using the word "PAPA" in this writing for Dr.MSB Sir. Parents not just give us life, they carve us as a human being, as an individual and make us get prepared to face this world full of challenges.

In my childhood days, he never sidelined the care of his family inspite of his busy schedule. This, he maintained till his last day of life. He always, not just loved me and encouraged me in schoolings but rectified me at proper times without any harsh words or gestures. He taught me how to convert my weakness into strength. He was not just a Father, but a "GURU" who shaped me into a Human Being that I am today.

I am lucky that I joined MBBS in BLDE medical college and could see papa as my teacher. During my under graduation, he never encouraged me to use his status in the institution. Rather, most of them were not aware in the initial days that I am DR.MSB's daughter. That is the time when I used to listen to many of my batchmates, seniors praising him as a great teacher and the role model to the students. Being his daughter, it used to make me feel very proud.



In spite of his busy clinical and administrative schedule, he always took personal care in my education and guided me as a parent. He always stood by me in tough times supported my decisions and guided me when I was in confusion. It may seem that he has just done his duty as a father, but I can't really put the things in words the support and care he has given me in my toughest times. Not just as a Father but as a Friend and a Guide. I and my sister are very lucky to have him as a Father because he never considered that his daughters are burden to him. But always considered us as his strength and pride.

I would like to mention an incident that shows what a great father he was and the love and concern he had for me. When my daughter "Artha" was about to be born prematurely and my entire family was in a panic state, he stood strong and left no stone unturned and ensured that I and my daughter get the best treatment possible. He travelled hundreds of kilometers without rest and brake just to make sure the things fall in place. He was the Vice-Chancellor of BLDE(DU) at the time. In spite of all his status, he stood like a layman outside the NICU day and night and ensured that my daughter came back home. Today, if my daughter is alive and is with me it is because of his efforts. During my stay in KLE Hospital I got to know that my father was not only popular in BLDE, but his admirers were there in KLE and beyond. That made me much prouder of being a daughter of such a great personality.

Papa was not just a caretaker of we two sisters, but also to many of my far relatives and residents of his native. He brought them to Bijapur and supported them financially and guided them to get a decent and dignified life. He had concern for every person around him and always tried to get the best for them.

As I said earlier, I am very lucky to be his student. He is one of the finest and most popular teachers of our time in the BLDE

Medical college. Students in various postings use to rush just to attend his rounds and were always inspired by his clinical acumen and patient care. Today, many of his undergraduate students took Medicine as their career only because of his inspiration. His thirst for knowledge always kept the student alive in him. At the age of 60 plus, every day, he used to read. Always motivated me to read and acquire new knowledge. His knowledge was beyond the field of medicine. He knew about every aspect of political; social; current affairs and agriculture. His way of analyzing a situation was extraordinary and many people used to consult him in difficult situations of their life. Till the last day of his life, he continued to think about patients and his students. When I was in Apollo hospital with him, doctors said he needed blood, the number of volunteers turned to donate blood was in hundreds and all of them were his students. This showed what a great teacher my Papa was. Today when I go to his clinic, his patients who are mainly villagers and illiterates regret his absence and cry in grief. Many families whom he was treating for long express their grief and sorrow, feel as if they have lost their own family member. They even express that he was God to them.

My Papa headed the post of Head of the department of Medicine, he worked as vice- principal, principal and left us when he was holding the post of Vice – Chancellor of BLDE(DU). Every post he held, he worked honestly and worked with dedication, even beyond his duty hours his priority was his institution. It is worth mentioning here, that in his clinical career of more than three decades, he worked only in Shri. B.M.Patil Medical College apart from his “PARISHRAM” Clinic. His every patient was admitted in this hospital, enriching the clinical material for his students. His vision and hard work today got his institution NAAC ‘A’ grade and also the increment in Undergraduate seats. During his isolation in the second wave of Covid, even though he himself was suffering, he was always thinking about the hospital and covid

patients. He was in continuous touch with the administrators instructing them for the best possible way of managing the patients, I could see the restlessness in him for not being there for the service of the patients suffering from covid. Till his last breath his priority was patients, students, society, family and putting himself at the last. During his tenure as VC of BLDE (DU), he ensured the well being of every worker of the university; be it on time salary or be it appropriate promotion; University was his priority and his family and the rest secondary.

Coming to his love for Farming, being a son of agriculturist, he always had a great passion for agriculture. Whenever he used to get time, he spent it in the farm and he had plans to give maximum of his time to it after his retirement. But it's really agonizing that today he made this place a permanent residence to rest in peace. And now when we visit this place, his existence is notified by the blooming greenery in the farm with its fruits and the calmness and happiness spread all over the farm just because of his presence.

The day you departed from us physically was the saddest day of my life. I really felt useless that I could not get you back home Papa. I felt the education; strength; boldness and more over the life you gave me was worthless as I could not do anything to get you back.

People say everything changes with time. But no Papa, time cannot change anything. I really miss your love and affection, your voice, your warmth, your ever smiling face. Everything is flashed every second, every moment of our life now. We all really Miss you a lot Papa. There is not even a single day without remembering you. You never said you are leaving nor Goodbye. You were gone before I knew it and only God knows why. Million times I needed you, million times I cried. If the love of your dear ones could have saved you, you would have never died.

Your memory is a treasure of our life. Your love is still our guide. I want you to know that you are my Angel and I hold on to your memories and I feel you watching over me everywhere I go. You were, are and will be my fiercest protector and I can always count on you to be there for me and you are always my SUPER HERO, wherever you are, I wish you loads and loads of happiness.
